      - 4. Gotterdammerung
    - iv. Begins the 3<sup>rd</sup> Act of the Opera;
  - b. Context
    - i. Repeated downward/upward scalar patterns in the strings
    - ii. Trilled and scalar exchanges in the woodwinds
    - iii. Dotted 8<sup>th</sup>/16<sup>th</sup> motor rhythm in the bassoons, horns and celli.

  - a. Unusual Harmonic and Interval Structure
  - b. Key B Minor/Major Not comfortable for trombonists
    - i. Make all notes in tune with a centered tone
    - ii. Maintaining the musical line in spite of shifting registers and tonalities
    - iii. Sectional intonation, blend
    - iv. Intervallic Leaps in the line

  - i. Range Demands, especially dynamic
  - ii. Intonation
